PREFACE

The series of international conferences on *CHANGING CITIES* aspires to bring together urban planners and designers, architects, landscape designers, urban geographers and historians, urban economists, urban sociologists, and urban policy makers, and investigate new challenges concerning cities and their future. The conference aims at becoming an international forum of transaction of ideas on cities' transitions. We have so far organised seven conferences, with peer-reviewed Proceedings, taken place always in June, in venues with unique urban and natural landscape, built heritage and place identity.

All Changing Cities conferences have been welcomed by the academic community worldwide, usually attracting about 300 presenters from many countries - Greece and Europe, USA and Canada, Latin America, Middle East and North Africa, Asia, Far East, and Oceania. On this basis, we believe the 7th Changing Cities conference will also be a successful academic event.

The 7th Changing Cities conference puts an emphasis on Artificial Intelligence (AI), and more specifically, how this recently emerged technological tool may support cities to pave their way to a sustainable future. To mention the most important applications:

- Urban Planning with Digital Twins, virtual replicas of the city—to simulate scenarios, test new infrastructure designs, and monitor urban growth before implementation.
- Environmental Sustainability: AI tools help cities adapt to climate change by mapping "urban heat islands" for tree planting, detecting wildfires early, and managing complex renewable energy grids.
- Traffic & Mobility Management: AI-driven systems analyze real-time data to adapt traffic lights, reducing congestion and vehicle emissions, suggesting the most fuel-efficient routes.
- Sustainable Tourism Development: AI enhances tourists' experiences by providing tailored recommendations; AI tracks and provides real-time data of environmental conditions and visitor impacts on natural resources; AI monitors foot traffic at historical sites, helping Local Authorities to manage visitor numbers against the phenomenon of 'overtourism' and protect cultural heritage.

In this framework, the main theme of the 7th Changing Cities conference is *'Artificial intelligence enhancing Cultural Heritage and Tourism Development in smart cities*.

This year, about 420 abstracts have been submitted by university professors, postgraduate and PhD students, and researchers in universities, research institutes, governmental organisations and Ministries, and private Planning and Design firms, from all over the world indicating the international character of the conference. Besides, 20 special sessions have been pre-organised by distinguished academics enriching the academic discussion on portraying applications of AI, highlighting urban actions and policies to enhance cultural heritage of cities, and safeguarding sustainable, smart tourism destinations.

However, the war in Middle East negatively affected the number of conference contributors who joined in person our conference. We have had several cancellations by colleagues in Israel, United Arab Emirates due to the fear of airports opening and closing, and the ambiguous status of flights. We also had several cancellations by colleagues from all other countries due to the energy crisis, restricted number of flights and expensive travelling. Under these conditions, we finally managed to have about 280 presentations –120 live presentations and 60 remote online presentations. Greece and Italy appear to have the great majority of live presenters.

Live-streaming action of the 1st day of the conference covering the Opening Ceremony, public addresses and keynote-speeches is a new action in the 7th Changing Cities conference, aiming at enhanced participation for the remote online presenters during the last conference day, and the creation of a global online forum for students' attendance.

I would like to thank the Organising Committee, the keynote speakers, and the members of the international scientific board who supported enthusiastically the academic organization of this conference – and especially those colleagues who have also pre-organized special sessions in this conference.

I would like to show our gratitude to the academic supporters University of Thessaly and University of Patras.

I would also like to express our gratitude to the sponsors of this conference that financially supported our conference in hard times.
